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## Effective January 1, 2019

## Adjusted Relocation Assistance Based on the Change in the Consumer Price Index (CPI)

Section 6-58.150.A, Alameda Municipal Code

The City of Alameda's <u>Rent Stabilization Ordinance</u> provides that a tenant is owed \$1,500 for moving expenses (in addition to the equivalent of up to four months' rent) when a tenancy is terminated for "no fault" of the tenant. This \$1,500 is to be adjusted each year based on the change in the Consumer Price Index.

2019 Relocation Assistance =

\$1,665.00 moving expenses

+ [(Number of years, or portion thereof, in the unit; Max = 4)

x (monthly rent averaged over the preceding 12 months)]

Moving Expenses Adjustment History:

- 2019 \$1,665.00 total moving expenses based on a 4.4% CPI change
- 2018 \$1,595.00 total moving expenses based on a 2.7% CPI change
- 2017 \$1,553.00 total moving expenses based on a 3.5% CPI change
- 2016 \$1,500.00 total moving expenses stated in the Ordinance

The amount of the adjusted moving expenses will apply to all notices of "no fault" terminations of tenancy served on and after January 1, 2019.

"No fault" terminations of tenancy include the following grounds:

- No cause - Capital improvement plan

Owner move-in - Withdrawal of the rental unit from the rental market

Demolition - Compliance with a governmental order
